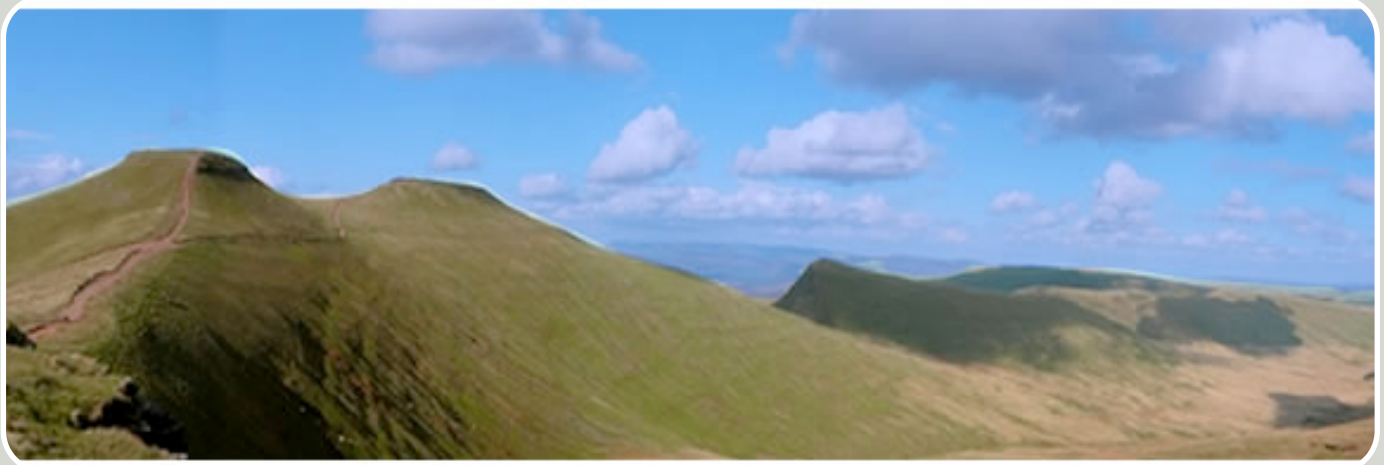

Usually people bring their own tents and camping equipment or caravans, but the Welsh Mission has tents and sleeping mats available if you need. The camp is self-catering, but we also have a small marquee where we serve meals for those don't fancy cooking for themselves.

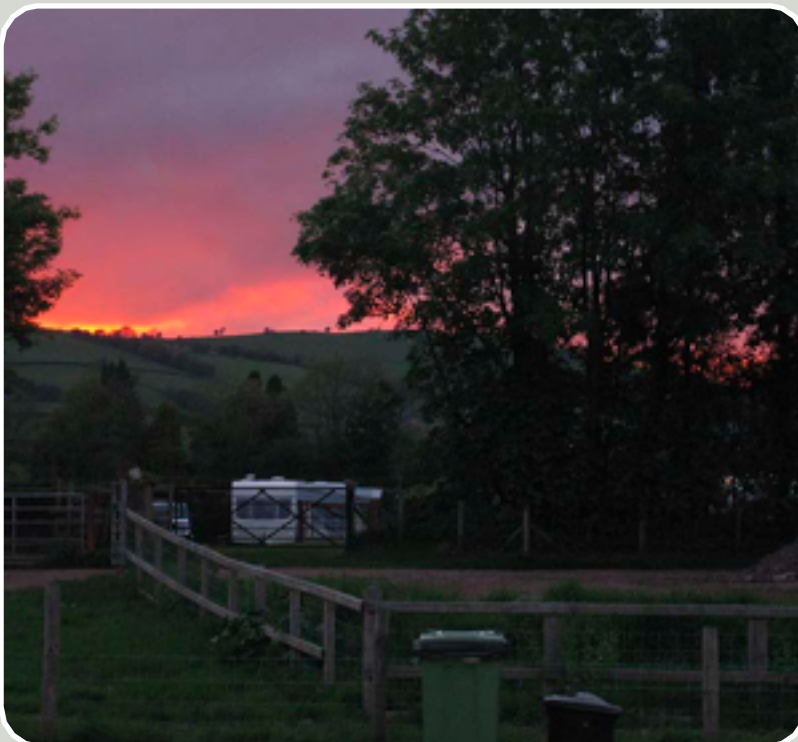
Things to do in and around Brecon Camp...

At Brecon camp there is always plenty of time for relaxation, just on the campsite itself or in the surrounding area. In the kitchen marquee you be able to get drinks and there'll be some games available to play. There's the River Usk which is good for a dip! There are lots of great places to walk to - the 'Viewpoint' overlooking the valley and campsite, and Pen-y-Fan which is the highest mountain in the area and has great views, or shorter walks along the river. For those of you who are feeling adventurous, Llangorse Multi-activity Centre (www.activityuk.com) is nearby, with climbing walls and a high ropes course, a zip wire and more, and is suitable for any level. It is also next to Llangorse Lake for those who like kayaking etc.

Here is all the information you need for the weekend: how much it costs; the campsite facilities; directions and how to apply.

Camping fees:

The cost for the weekend is £24 a unit (a caravan, large tent or group of smaller tents pitched together). Camping fees will be collected on Sunday morning, after the morning worship. If you'd like to stay longer, all you need to do is speak to the farmer and arrange it with him.

Campsite facilities:

Aberbran is a self-catering camp which has running water but no electricity. We will have portaloos, and there is also a chemical disposal point for those with caravans. Meetings are held in the marquee. There's a kitchen tent also for those who are having meals, and where you can get hot drinks etc. The campsite is dog-friendly.

Please bring:

Apart from all your usual camping gear, please bring:

- a Bible
- a camping chair
- a musical instrument if you'd like to help with worship
- waterproofs
- walking shoes
- wellington boots
- swimming gear if you fancy a dip in the river!

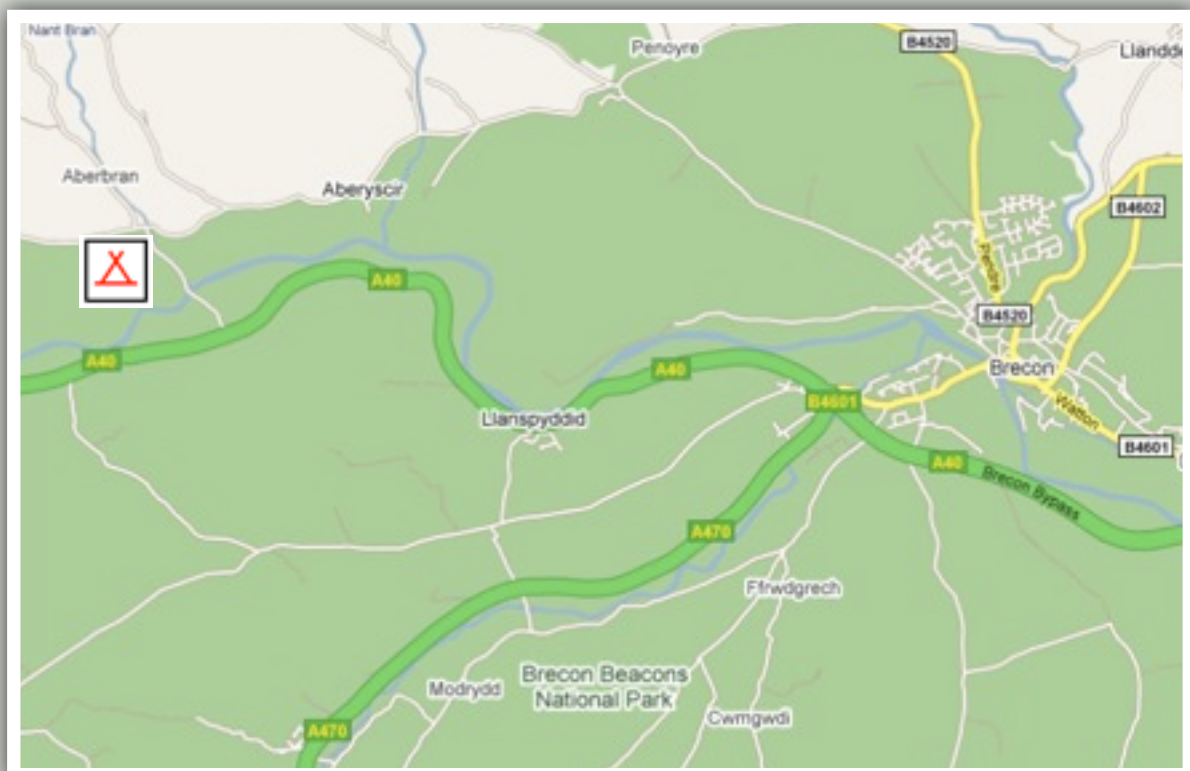
